What is Healthwatch?

Healthwatch Ealing is an independent organisation set up to champion the views of health and social care service users. It strives to make sure that health and social care services are meeting local needs and to ensure that the public's voice is heard regarding how local services are run. Healthwatch also makes sure that the public is informed on any plans to change those services, and in identifying gaps in services.

About the role

Your Voice in Health and Social Care (YVHSC) are looking for Ealing residents interested in becoming part of Healthwatch Ealing. We are looking for people to join our committee with local knowledge, experience and passion for promoting better health and social care for local people.

The committee represents an advisory body overseeing strategic direction and monitoring the progress of Healthwatch Ealing. You will be responsible for shaping the future of the organisation and establishing the basis for building a large local membership from all communities in the borough.

Is this the right role for me?

We are keen to welcome applicants from across the Ealing community. In particular, we would very much like applications from BAME groups, and from across the age range. Don't worry if you have no previous experience; we provide a comprehensive programme of induction and training. Volunteering with Healthwatch also provides a broad introduction to the wider field of work within the health sector and will be helpful to individuals interested in the area.



A Healthwatch Ealing Committee Member should:

- Have a flexible schedule. Time commitment varies between 3-10 hours a month on a flexible schedule. Committee meetings vary but are roughly once every two months. There may be other events and meetings that you are requested to attend.
- Have experience or an interest in the health and social care sector in Ealing. Medical students & practitioners, third sector workers and those with experience working with the Local Authority or CCG are all welcome.
- Enjoy working as part of a collaborative team.
- Be diligent and take pride in their work. Committee members are expected to prepare adequately for meetings they attend. Making sure they read through reports and other documents to highlight errors, problems and issues that can then be raised in committee meetings or otherwise.
- Be able to identify areas for personal training and self-development and attend relevant training and events as required.

Tasks

- Oversee governance of Healthwatch Ealing, working with your fellow committee members and the committee chair. Committee members are expected to attend all committee meetings.
- Participate in other committees/groups where required.
- Contribute to the scrutiny of health and social care service providers in the borough of Ealing to ensure that patients, service users, carers and the wider community is satisfied with the service that they receive.
- Identify, approve and oversee a range of projects through to evaluation of impact and publishing of reports.
- To oversee the development of a comprehensive community strategy to ensure Healthwatch Ealing is reaching the diverse communities of Ealing.
- To be involved as the outward face of Healthwatch Ealing at Public Engagement events and conferences, demonstrate leadership and take an active role in public and membership engagement.
- Provide appropriate management, advice, support and challenge to the Healthwatch Ealing Staff.
- Build and maintain good relationships with key stakeholders, including members of the public, patients, service users, carers, Healthwatch England, the Department of Health, Care Quality Commission, Monitor (Regulator of NHS Foundation Trusts), NHS funded providers, Ealing Clinical Commissioning Group, Ealing Health & Wellbeing Board, and Ealing Council.
- Ensure that Healthwatch Ealing is represented on the Ealing Health and Wellbeing Board and plays a proactive role in decisions relating to the Health and Wellbeing Strategy, planning, commissioning and delivery of health and social care.
